Description of speakers :

Mariela Wismann, Director of the Good Food for Cities programme in Latin America, Rikolto

Facilitating multi-actor processes is both an art and a science. Mariela will present **the key concepts**, **attitudes and tools** required to set up a co-creation process within the framework of multi-stakeholder partnerships. Her presentation will draw on <u>the toolbox</u> developed by Rikolto to train its collaborators and partners, as well as on its extensive experience of co-creation in the field of sustainable food systems in Latin America.

Amal Erragh, territorial coordinator, Enabel in Morocco

Amal will talk about **territorial co-creation** in Morocco, as an innovative process aimed at encouraging collaboration between different stakeholders to design and co-produce territorial projects. The Moroccan context, characterised by a rich cultural and regional diversity, and geographical, linguistic and cultural specificities, has profoundly influenced the co-creation approach adopted. This **multi-actor approach** encourages the participation of citizens, civil society organisations, public institutions and the private sector, with the aim of developing solutions specific to each locality.

Hélène Lambert, Project Manager for Citizen Participation, Gender Equality and Social Inequalities, Enabel in Morocco



Hélène will discuss the general challenges of **inclusion** in co-creation and the strategies put in place as part of a citizen participation project in Morocco. Firstly, the general challenges relating to inclusion in co-creation processes will be presented. Secondly, Hélène will present the approach and strategies adopted to encourage the involvement and consideration of the needs of women and young people, including those from disadvantaged groups, in a project aimed at supporting the dynamics of citizen participation in Morocco, in particular through co-creation.

The sustainable cities platform

The JSF **Sustainable Cities** is a platform created as part of a grant programme funded by the Belgian federal government DGD (Directorate-General for Development Cooperation and Humanitarian Aid) within which stakeholders discuss, exchange and collaborate on the contribution to sustainable cities in the world through international cooperation. The platform has 5 active members: VVSG (Association of Flemish Cities and Municipalities) - the platform's lead organisation, UVCW (the Union of Cities and Municipalities of Wallonia), Brulocalis (the Association of the City and Municipalities of Brussels), the NGO Echos Communication, and the NGO Rikolto. A number of other players, including NGOs,



institutional players and Enabel, are closely involved in developing the activities. Together, these actors are working to create sustainable cities that achieve the SDGs. The sustainable city operates within the ecological limits of the planet while guaranteeing the minimum social conditions necessary for the well-being of its inhabitants.
